# Recommendations of the Denominator/Numerator workgroup

#### **Definitions:**

Denominator data: Population estimates

Decennial: Every 10 years (2000, 2010, 2020, ...)

Intercensal: Between, and bracketed by, 2 decennial years

Postcensal: Years after a decennial year, but before the next decennial year

# Principles for annual

1. Denominator data (population estimates)

- a. BBER will provide postcensal estimates for each year.
- b. BBER can provide updated postcensal estimates for preceding years (e.g. can provide updated 2011 estimates with its 2012 estimates).
- c. DOH will not use updated postcensal estimates to update rates<sup>1</sup>.
- d. Each decennial year, BBER will provide updated intercensal estimates for the prior decade.
- e. DOH will use updated intercensal estimates to update rates.

### 2. Numerator data

a. Annual numerator data will be provided by the data source (annual frozen file).

b. Numerator data that is registered/received after the annual data is produced will be included in next annual data file after it is registered/received.
